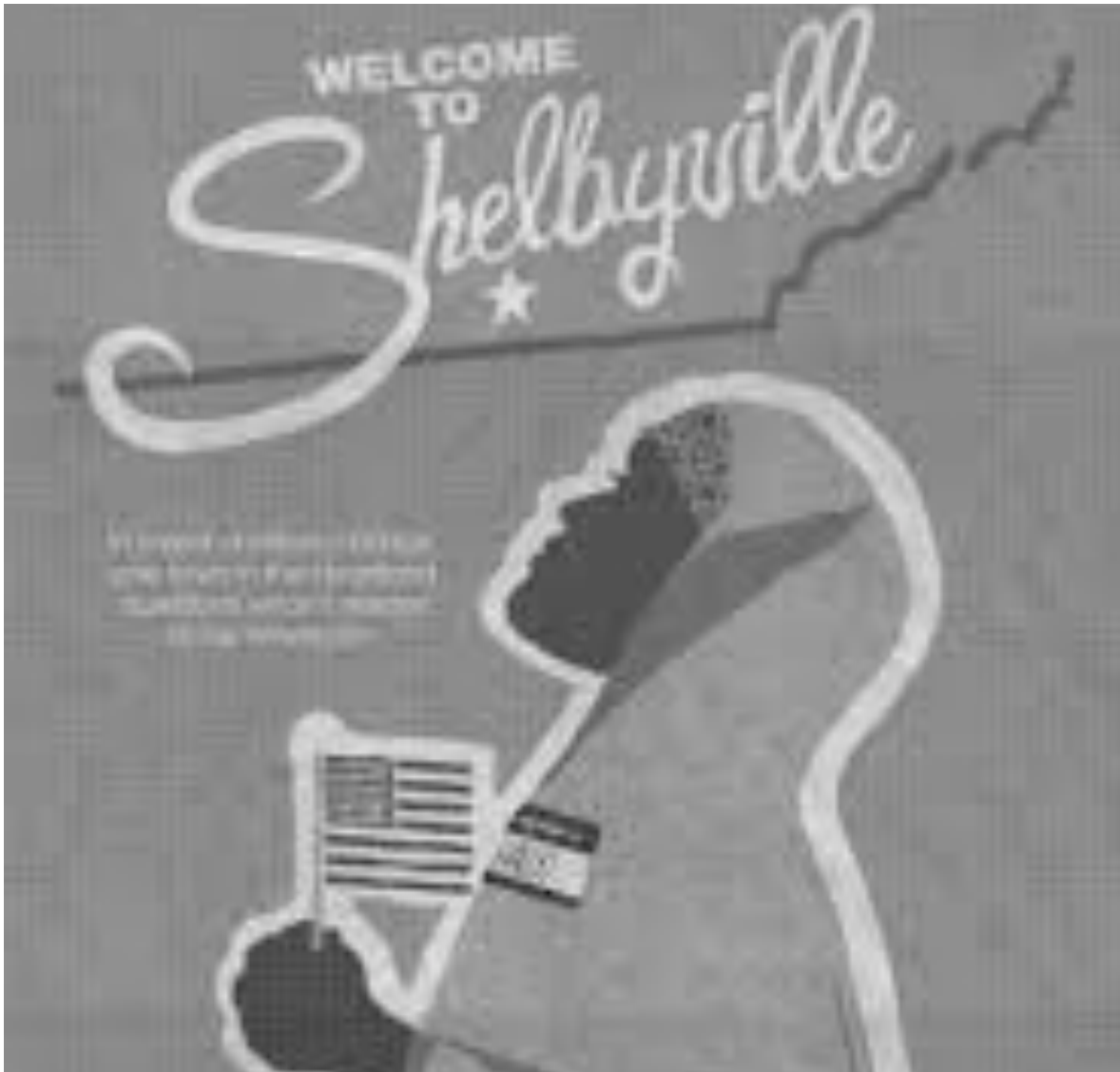


# SPRING 2013 SOCIAL JUSTICE FILM SERIES



**About the film:** **Welcome to Shelbyville** is a glimpse of America at a crossroads. In this one small town in the heart of America's Bible Belt, a community grapples with rapidly changing demographics. Just a stone's throw away from Pulaski, Tennessee (the birthplace of the Ku Klux Klan), longtime African American and white residents are challenged with how best to integrate with a growing Latino population and the more recent arrival of hundreds of Muslim Somali refugees. Set on the eve of the 2008 election, the town finds itself embroiled in a struggle to come to terms with a new wave of immigrants and grappling with what it means to be American.
